Gold Final

Four players progressed to the semi-finals: **Alex Warren**, **George Partridge**, **Jayden Davies**, and **Cole Fortesque**, with all four completing all five rounds. The final came down to George and Cole, where George delivered a composed and accurate performance, scoring **11 points** to take the win. Interestingly, semi-final scores were higher—perhaps the final's intensity and audience presence added extra pressure!
